Homecoming Court Nominations

The time has come to nominate students for the **2019 Homecoming Coronation Court.** Each group on campus (including residence halls, Greek organizations, athletic groups, academic organizations, etc.) has the opportunity and privilege to nominate. Attached is a form on which your organization should place the names of your nominees.

The rules for nomination are as follows:

- 1. Your organization may only nominate one male and one female from each class.
- 2. Your organization must have members from each class from which you make nominations
- 3. Your organization may nominate people from outside your organization.
- 4. The deadline for nominations is **Wednesday, September 11th** to the Office of Student Life

Each nominee will be notified between Friday, September 13th and Sunday, September 15th. At this point, the nominee has the option to e-mail a photo of him or herself or have a photo taken of him or herself at the office, the following week (Sept. 16th- Sept. 18), so voters can recognize the names.

The **2019 Homecoming Coronation Court Nominations** will contain the names of all students nominated. The sponsors of each nominee will **not** be identified. Voting will be held from **Monday, September 23rd - Wednesday, September 25th** in the Brew area on the 4th floor of The Gerber Center.

The individuals who receive the most votes from each class will be become the **2019 Homecoming Coronation Court**. The court includes the top four senior males and females, the top three junior males and females, and the top three sophomore males and females. The winner of each class, male and female, will be announced at the **Coronation Ceremony on Friday, October 4th.**

3rd Annual Games

WHEN: Tuesday, October 1st @ 6:00 p.m. WHERE: Lower Quad

Each competition on this day will have its own set or rules. Three judges are needed for each competition. All events receive points, at the end of the Homecoming Games, these points are added up for an overall winner. There will be a first, second, and third place winner. All participating members of the Third and Second place teams receive medals. All participating members of the First place team receive medals and laurels.

- 6 participants per team
- Entry forms are due to the OSL office by Monday, September 9th.

This is the order in which the events will take place and the times that they should begin at.

Long Jump

<u>Goal:</u> To jump the furthest from a standing position.

<u>Rules:</u> One member from each team will participate. There will be 5 jumpers going at a time. (Adjust accordingly, if more or less teams are present) Jumps are measured from the heel of the jumper to the line that is closest to and behind them.

Points: See general points.

Set-Up & Materials Needed: Measuring Tape

Frisbee

Distance

Goal: Throw the frisbee the furthest, within the boundaries of the arena.

<u>Rules:</u> One thrower at a time. Frisbee must land within the boundaries of the arena. Cannot hit outer barriers or audience members, or else the throw is not counted. Each thrower gets a practice throw that does not count, and one counted throw. Foot of thrower must stay behind designated line, or the throw is not counted.

Points: See general points.

Set-Up & Materials Needed: Frisbees, measuring tape, cones (for boundary markers)

Accuracy

<u>Goal:</u> Throw the frisbee in the target, or as close to it as possible.

<u>Rules:</u> One at a time, stay behind the designated line. One practice throw that is not counted and one attempt that is counted.

<u>Points:</u> See general points. If the throw is in the target, that thrower receives 4 points for their team. If there are multiple, they both receive 4 points.

<u>Set-Up & Materials Needed:</u> Frisbees, measuring tapes, hula hoops

Wheelbarrow Race

Goal: Be the fastest pair

Rules: Race to the far line, switch people behind the line and race back to the finish line.

Changes must be fully complete before resuming racing or else disqualified. Racers may not touch other teams.

Points: See general points.

Set-Up & Materials Needed: No additional materials needed.

Foot Race

<u>Goal:</u> Be the fastest to go down the length of the arena and back

<u>Rules:</u> Must start behind the line, must touch the far line with hand before returning. May not touch interfere with any other racers.

Points: See general points

Auditions are mandatory for those wanting to participate and will be from 7:00pm-11:00pm Tuesday, September 11th in Centennial Hall. Please contact Haley Clebanoff and Andrew Thumann if interested or come into the Office of Student Life & Leadership and fill in a time slot.
- To ensure all acts have sufficient stage time, acts will be limited to a maximum of 5-7 minutes each. Depending on the number of entries, the Talent Showcase Co-Chairs may need to limit the number of acts.
- Auditions will be held on September 16th and 17th at 7:00pm in Centennial Hall.
- There will be a required Talent Show Dress Rehearsal on September 26th at 7:00pm in Centennial Hall.

Rules:

- -Ten (10) participants per team
- -Three Categories: Fraternities, Sororities, and Student Organizations

Performances will be judged on the following criteria:

- ORIGINALITY!
- Unity and Coherence of the group
- Clarity
- Costumes
- Time

RULES:

- Words and description of actions will be reviewed by the yell co-chairs prior to the event.
 If changes are necessary, your group will be contacted by Friday, September 20th.
 Revised words will be due by Monday, September 23rd.
- Changes to words and actions may not be made after final version is approved. This includes changes the night of the performance.
- Target time of each act should be 2-3 minutes starting upon entry to the floor or first words spoken. Points will be deducted for acts below one minute and 50 seconds or above 3 minutes and 10 seconds. See attached evaluation form for specific details.
- Acts may not contain any obscene language, gestures, or any previously unedited material
- There is to be absolutely nothing thrown. This includes glitter, confetti, food, or any other objects.
- There is to be absolutely no "bashing/disrespecting" other groups (including other greek groups/administrators/people on campus).
- Groups within the crowd viewing a Yell routine should not be disorderly or participating in indecent conduct. (Support cheering is encouraged). It is the discretion of the Yell Co-Chairs to deem if the group's actions within the audience are inappropriate.
- Anyone suspected to be under the influence of alcohol will not be allowed in PepsiCo. If a member of the yell group is suspected, that person will be asked to leave and will not be able to participate.

CONSEQUENCES:

- Failure to comply with the above rules may result in the **group's disqualification from competition and POSSIBLE FINES.** The Homecoming Committee will determine disqualification.
- Non-Greek students violating these rules will be referred to the Dean of Students Office. Greek Students will be referred to the Greek Judicial and Standards Board (GJSB).
- Clean up (if necessary) of the facility, and/or clean up fees.
- Fines are for entire group (these are minimum fines with possibility of referral to GJSB or Dean of Students Office).
 - \$50 for each incident of obscene language or gesture
 - \$100 for disorderly or indecent conduct and **unapproved lyrics**
 - \$125 for nudity
 - \$250 for "bashing" other groups
 - \$500 for being under the influence of alcohol
 - \$500 for open flames (includes lighters, matches, fireworks, etc.)

IN ADDITION

- Uniformed Officers will be placed throughout PepsiCo Recreation Center. Please note that these Officers will issue tickets/arrest individuals if necessary.
- Organization Presidents will be held responsible for the actions of their group.
- If certain conduct is not acceptable, groups will be referred to the GJSB or the Dean of Students Office for their actions. Groups with unacceptable conduct are automatically disqualified from the current year Yell Competition, as well as face potential disqualification from the next year's Yell Competition.
 - The overall winner will be asked to perform their winning routine the following Friday, October 4th, in between the Coronation and Sing competition in Centennial Hall.

WHEN: Friday, October 4th Following the Coronation Ceremony WHERE: Centennial Hall

Performances will be judged on the following criteria:

- Incorporation of Theme
- Originality
- Unity and Coherence of the group
- Clarity
- Costumes

RULES:

- Target time of an act should be 4 minutes, but not to exceed 8 minutes in length. Points will be deducted for acts under 4 minutes or above 8 minutes. See attached evaluation form for specific details.
- Changes to the lyrics and actions may not be made after a final version is turned in. This includes changes the night of the performance.
- Acts may not contain any obscene language, gestures, or any previously unedited material.
- There is to be absolutely nothing thrown on or from the stage. This includes glitter, confetti, food, or any other objects.
- There is absolutely no "bashing/disrespecting" other groups (including other greek groups/administrators/people on campus).
- Groups within the crowd viewing a Sing should not be disorderly or participating in indecent conduct (support cheering is encouraged). It is the discretion of the Sing Co-Chairs to deem if the group's actions within the audience are inappropriate.
- Anyone suspected to be under the influence of alcohol will not be permitted into Centennial. If a member of the Sing group is suspected, that person will be asked to leave and will not be able to participate.

CONSEQUENCES:

- Failure to comply with the above rules may result in the **group's disqualification from competition and POSSIBLE FINES.** The Homecoming Committee will determine disqualification.
- Non-Greek students violating these rules will be referred to the Dean of Students Office. Greek Students will be referred to the Greek Judicial and Standards Board (GJSB).
- Clean up (if necessary) of the facility, and/or clean up fees.
- Fines are for entire group (these are minimum fines with possibility of referral to GJSB or Dean of Students Office).
 - \$50 for each incident of obscene language or gesture
 - o \$100 for disorderly or indecent conduct and **unapproved lyrics**
 - o \$125 for nudity
 - \$250 for "bashing" other groups
 - \$500 for being under the influence of alcohol
 - \$500 for open flames (includes lighters, matches, fireworks, etc.)

IN ADDITION

- Uniformed Officers will be placed throughout Centennial (including staging area). Please note that these Officers will issue tickets/arrest individuals if necessary.
- Organization Presidents will be held responsible for the actions of their group.
- If certain conduct is not acceptable, groups will be referred to the GJSB or the Dean of Students Office for their actions. Groups with unacceptable conduct are automatically disqualified from the current year Sing Competition, as well as face potential disqualification from the next year's Sing Competition.
- A rehearsal will take place in Centennial on Sunday, September 29th, from starting at 2 pm.

If needed, all edited lyrics and movements must be resubmitted to the Sing Co-Chairs for re-evaluation by **Monday, September 24th.**

Again, rehearsals will take place on Sunday, September 29th starting 2 PM in Centennial Hall. Your group's assigned rehearsal time will be sent to the contact person of each group and will be posted in the Office of Student Activities. This is your group's only rehearsal and each group is limited to 30 minutes of rehearsal stage time.

Cardboard Regatta

WHEN: Saturday, October 6th @ 11:00 a.m. WHERE: The Slough

This year we are pleased to announce the annual Augustana Cardboard Regatta will be held again in The Slough. Cardboard Regatta first originated in 1974 at Southern Illinois University and the Homecoming Committee enjoys joining in on the fun with our own rendition of the sport.

The rules are simple. Participants are to create a boat and oars completely out of cardboard using only the following materials:

- Tape
- Glue
- Staples
- Paint
- Wax
- Rope
- Caulk or silicone

No Styrofoam, plastics, fiberglass, or wood is allowed. The boat must support two people for the length of the slough starting on the far side away from the library and ending closest to the library. The two people must remain completely in the boat or face disqualification. The brackets for the regatta will be determined on the number of participants signed up. There are three categories: fraternities, sororities, and student organizations. There will also be lifeguards on site in the event of a sinking.

There will be a Pre-Race Meeting at 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, October 5th, in Olin. At the meeting, the Regatta Co-Chairs will discuss the rules and racing bracket.

The race will take place in any kind of weather, except for lighting or high winds.
