Sample language faculty might consider for use in their syllabi is listed below.

Language related to the credit hour policy is required for all syllabi. It is best practice to include language about support services and campus resources.

Learning objectives for the course, how these relate to college-wide learning outcomes (see sample syllabus language)

Clear and detailed attendance policy that is consistent with the Attendance Policy approved by faculty in May 2024 should be stated in the syllabus (see Excessive absences under Registration, Enrollment & Attendance in the College Catalog). Religious holiday policy

Consistent with our commitment to creating an academic community that welcomes and respects religious diversity, we commit ourselves to making every reasonable effort to support students in observing major religious holidays without academic or co-curricular penalty. Peer Academic Coaching and Workshops

Peer Subject Tutoring

The Learning Commons offers free peer tutoring to help students succeed in their courses. Tutors ask guiding questions to encourage deeper thinking about course concepts, discuss exam preparation strategies, and break down complex problems. Rather than giving out answers, tutors act as guides and coaches so that students can master the skills on their own.

Reading/Writing Center

The Reading/Writing Center (RWC), located in Gerber 423, provides feedback for any student, on any reading/writing assignment, in any class. Staffed by 23 peer tutors and four faculty tutors, the RWC is a free service. Students are encouraged to come early and often, scheduling in-person appointments and/or requesting feedback via email as they wish. We also take walk-ins as our schedule allows.

In-person appointments with peer or faculty tutors are 40 minutes long and are ideal for brainstorming and early-stage drafting, reading-related sessions, or just having a friendly conversation about all things reading/writing.

Feedback via email is a good option for those who aren't available during RWC open hours or who would prefer to communicate via writing rather than face-to-face.
