Major Overview

The 42-credit CSD major is a pre-professional program for students who may choose to pursue graduate study in speech-language pathology, audiology, or a related discipline. CSD majors complete coursework that covers essentials of human communication, communication differences, and communication disorders. In their senior year, CSD majors participate in clinical or community practicum experiences and engage in research writing through their senior inquiry sequence.

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
